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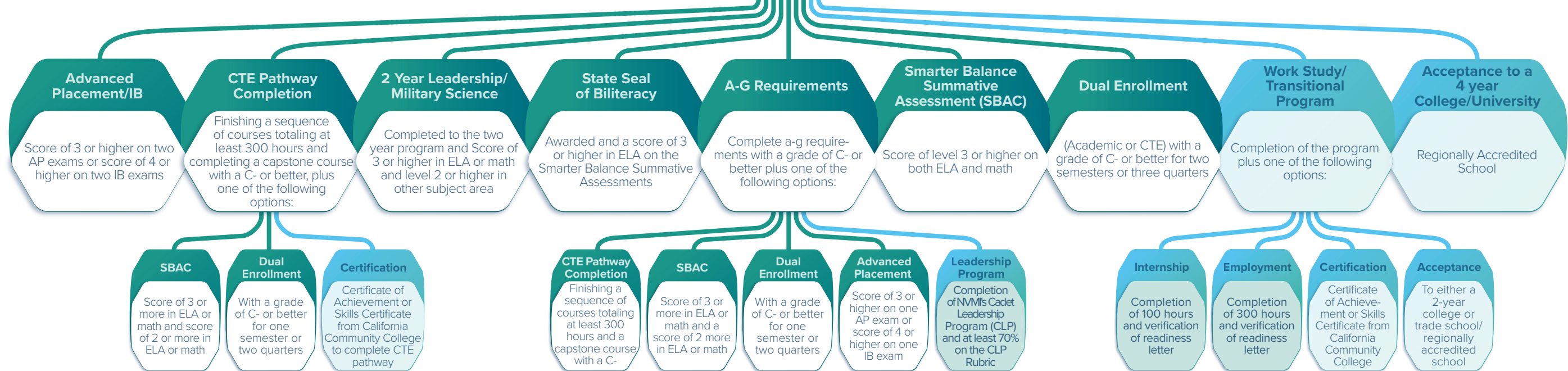
The Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), in collaboration with two of the county's authorized alternative charter schools, DaVinci RISE and the North Valley Military Institute, used the A-GAME process to add more college and career-ready opportunities than are currently recognized by the state in its college and career readiness measure. Using A-GAME facilitated discussions, LACOE learned of and appreciated the many diverse college and career-readiness opportunities that the schools provide. Though some of the pathways illustrated in the flow-chart are still under development, we believe that authorizers and alternative schools, alike, can benefit from the thinking expanded of the group about which pathways prepare students for a successful future. Pathways flowing through multiple shapes in the diagram indicate that a student needs to complete each item along the pathway to be considered college or career ready.

Conditionally College and Career Ready

Students will be conditionally college ready if they have completed their high school graduation requirement and the school has facilitated a link to an adult transitional agency. The student will be considered college and career ready when they are actively engaged for 6 months* in one of the following:

(Enrolled with an, Client of an) Other Post-Secondary Transitions

Prior to graduation, school facilitated meeting(s) with outside adult transitional agency. Within one year of graduation the student completes one of the following options (collected through post secondary data):
