

## **Alternative Accountability Report: Summary of NWEA Growth Analysis**

## **Using Fall Grade Level Equivalency Scores as Starting Point**

This document outlines the results of analysis conducted by Momentum Strategy & Research, looking into the average growth of alternative education students from the 2015 Alternative Norming Sample.¹ Below we provide three tables, one each for mathematics, reading, and language usage. These tables outline the students' Grade Level Equivalent (GLE--based on their fall RIT score), the corresponding range of RIT scores applicable to each GLE, and the average growth all students with fall RIT scores falling in that range for Fall to Winter, Winter to Spring, and Fall to Spring.

In addition, we have provided the amount of growth needed for students to be considered "On Track" to progress to the next grade level. "On Track" for this purpose was determined by computing the increase in average RIT for Fall and Winter, Winter and Spring, and Fall and Spring from the NWEA Normative Data report.<sup>2</sup>

Taken together, these data can be used to set targets for student growth that balance actual growth observed for alternative students across the country and that needed to progress in grade level skill. As increasing the skill level of alternative education students is paramount to their success, when the average growth of alternative school students differ from the growth needed to progress to the next GLE we recommend using the larger of the two to establish individual student's growth targets.
